





Houston's mapping system is based on the city's history of redlining, segregation, and divestment. This history is apparent by simply crossing into different neighborhoods, where cultural differences and resources often vary depending on race and economic status.

Established as a City of Houston Program housed within the Housing and Community Development Department in 1999





Expanded as a Local Government Nonprofit Corporation in 2018 and 501c-3 Nonprofit Organization in 2022




