

- Input from the community has been vital to developing this strategy and in prioritizing infrastructure projects




Adopt-An-Esplanade Program Irvington Blvd at E Crosstimbers St

 August 2022: public meeting to learn more about infrastructure and mobility needs in the community










 August 2022: Collected surveys with Super Neighborhood 46 at the Berry Elementary Pop-Up Art Market



Airline Drive



Purpose

To improve safety and access to transit and key commercial destinations in the District

Scope


- Limits: Parker Road to North Main Street
- Length: 4.3 miles

Proposed Improvements

- Intersection improvements at Berry Road and Gibbs Street / Link Road / Service Street
- Improve crosswalks and ADA ramps
- Improve pavement markings
- Additional wayfinding signage and custom street signs
- Landscaping and beautification

Cost

• ~\$5.9 million



Proposed Cross Section

Repurposing a travel lane to improve safety and enhance the pedestrian realm from 28th Street to North Main Street.

Berry Road Intersection

Cross section will include:

- One travel lane each direction with a center lane
- Shared use paths on both sides of the roadway



The proposed improvements and cross sections are subject to change based on final design and approval.



- Increase pedestrian safety
- Signage and warning beacons to
- Provides refuge when crossing















Berry Road



Purpose

To improve safety and provide enhanced multimodal access, particularly for students

Scope

• Limits: Airline Drive to Jensen Drive

• Length: 2.5 miles

Proposed Improvements

- Install new sidewalks or shared use paths
- Improve lighting and signage
- Address drainage concerns as needed
- Roadway rehabilitation where needed

Cost

• ~\$17.3 million

Proposed Safety Improvements at Intersection



The proposed improvements and cross sections are subject to change based on final design and approval.

Jensen Drive



Purpose

To provide safer multimodal access to transit and commercial destinations

Scope

- Limits: Parker Road to Kelley Street
- Length: 3.3 miles

Proposed Improvements

- Short: Intersection improvements
- Long: Full reconstruction
- Install sidewalks, bike lanes, or shared use paths
- Upgrade pavements markings, crosswalks, signage, and wayfinding, lighting, transit amenities, drainage, utilities
- Urban design elements
- Landscaping and beautification

~\$95 million

The proposed improvements and cross sections are subject to change based on final design and approval.

Proposed Cross Sections Typical: 16' Median 80' Observed Width Entrances to businesses will be determined on a case by case basis Esplanade Options: Shared public space for pedestrians & cyclists One (1) travel lane in each direction with 54-foot center

Proposed Intersection Improvements



Short-Term Improvements

Two (2) travel lanes in each direction

- Increase pedestrian safety at Aldine Westfield Road
- · Improve turning movements at McDonald's south of Tidwell Road

Tidwell Road



Purpose

To improve safety and enhance multimodal access across the District

Scope

- Limits: Nordling Street to Irvington Boulevard
- Length: 1.7 miles

Proposed Improvements

- Short-term: Spot improvements
- Long-term: Full reconstruction
 - Widen sidewalks
 - Install median with pedestrian refuge
 - Landscaping / Beautification
 - Address drainage concerns

Cost

• ~\$73 million

Short-Term Improvements


Spot improvements on sidewalks, ADA ramps, crosswalks, pavement markings



Long-Term Improvements

Cross section will include:

- 6-foot sidewalks on both sides
- 6-foot median with pedestrian refuge
- Dedicated left turn lanes



The proposed improvements and cross sections are subject to change based on final design and approval.







Sidewalk Programs (3)

- Multimodal connections to neighborhoods, schools, parks, and transit

• Improving connections to parks

Hardy Street and Elysian Street

• Enhance bike lanes
